PRAYER REQUEST DETAILS

The persecuted church: Sudan (Contact: Ken Nash)

A Sudanese couple who were threatened with death because of their Christian faith have found safety in the United States.

After Nada and her husband Hamouda were convicted of converting to Christianity, they faced 100 lashes each and a year in exile. Some of their family were also threatening to kill them.

Changing religion was decriminalized in 2020, yet people still face attacks and arrest. Nada and Hamouda were accused of "criminal adultery" as a Sharia (Islamic law) court ruled that their marriage had become illegal after Hamouda converted to Christianity.

Religious freedom group ADF International supported Nada and Hamouda in their court case, but helped evacuate them to the USA after the court decision and death threats. The couple and their children are overjoyed to be free.

However, elsewhere in Sudan a Coptic monastery was attacked by rebels fighting the Sudanese government. Christian Solidarity Worldwide reports that the Rapid Support Forces attacked the monastery in Wad Madani, Gezira State, on 16 December and are now using it as a military base.

At least five priests, five novices and four workers have been missing since the attack.

Sudan has recently experienced tumultuous political changes. Until recently, the government criminalised apostasy and adultery charges have been used to punish converts.

Evangelism Behind bars!

Missionaries Olly and Scott have been running an evangelistic course in Pentonville Prison chapel. Most of the guys have no hope or self-esteem. Olly and Scott teach that God accepts sinners and offers to all His forgiveness and free gift of Grace. At the end of the course, 4 prisoners accepted Christ!

Scott says Sunday is his best day because he loves to share the good news of Jesus. For some it is the first time they have heard of Jesus!

LCM's involvement with churches in Gospel outreach.

Many churches such as St Cuthberts seek to equip Christians to reach out to their communities with the Good News of Jesus. St Cuthbert's and LCM distribute Luke's Gospels round the parish and one man started coming after reading the gospel and was hungry to know more. Many languages are spoken at St Cuthberts. This church is reaching the most marginalised and least reached people in Britain.

Holy Trinity Hounslow regularly set up a Christian book table where 3 missionaries 'gossip the Gospel' with passers-by who stop to browse. One Friday 7 people prayed a prayer of commitment following conversations at the book table!

Rough sleepers.

In Tower Hamlets alone there are 460 every night. Many are alcoholics or drug addicts. LCM has started a Bible study at a hostel for people battling addiction. They report a tremendous thirst among people for God's Word, especially Muslims during Ramadan (starts 10th March) when many have visions and dreams about Jesus. Pray that many will turn to Him at this time!

It is very exciting that so many that LCM witness come from countries closed to the Gospel. London is full of such people. What an opportunity!

- Please pray that we have a good attendance of local Christians from local Churches to hear about the work in North Norfolk on Saturday the 16th in the Parish Hall at 2.30pm.
- Our membership is very small, only four. Please pray that more may join us in the work of offering scriptures to local schools, hotels and residential homes.
 - There is also other evangelist work such as the Aylsham Show with the Christian organisation called Farming Link. Last year we could not take up the offer of the work because we had too few members. All of our work is not onerous and can be done fitting it within one's schedule. The only qualification is being a committed Christian who loves God's word.
- We hope to contact over 80 hotel and bed and breakfast establishments in the next few weeks. Please pray that they will accept the free gift of God's word.
- Thank God that the first hotel contacted this year, Beechwood, North Walsham now has a Hotel Bible in each room. Please pray that visitors to the area may take the opportunity to read one.

CAP – Christians Against Poverty (Contact: Jess and Anne Mary Stubenbord)

C.A.P. Prayer Points

Recently the gap between the richest and poorest, the powerful and the powerless has been shown to be widening more in the UK than in most affluent countries, according to the Institute for Fiscal Studies. So, may we encourage you to pray as CAP and other organisations direct us?

- 1. Prayer for those in poverty
 - Pray for those trapped in poverty to find the right help and to find Jesus, who can help them now and in the future.
 - Pray for those who are without food, shelter, family, etc. James declares that we should look after orphans and widows in need, as that please the Lord (1:27)

- Pray for those who are in areas of deprivation where the odds are often stacked against them from birth.
- Pray for those who urgently need NHS medical and dental treatment.

Are there ways we can help those who suffer from deprivation in our community? Praise God for Mustard Seed, N. Norfolk Food Bank, etc. that our church members are running.

- 2. Prayer for those in power who can change things for the better
 - Pray for those in power to recognise their need of Jesus for all the things that money cannot buy.
 - Pray that those with money will give generously to social concerns.
 - Pray for those who make decisions and policy about the NHS that they would be motivated by compassion, channelling money to where it is most needed.
 - Pray for business owners and employers to give people a fair wage for their workers' labours.
 - Pray God will raise up more to speak out for those who have no or little voice and influence.

CPAS (Contact: Vivienne Benford)

- There are three kinds of Residential Holidays offered by CPAS: Ventures for children and young people 8- to 18-year-old, Falcons for the same age group but would suit youngsters who may face disadvantage or are experiencing difficult circumstances in their lives and then School Ventures for primary pupils attending Church of England Schools. Bookings are now open, and leaders are to be recruited for this summer. Please pray for the children making the decision to enrol and pray for leaders to volunteer.
- In the past year CPAS has seen a number of changes in staff.
 Please pray for those who have moved on to new challenges and for the new colleagues who have already brought fresh ideas and insights that are making an impact.

Hope into Action (Contact: Katharine Checketts)

The annual conference day is on 7 March. Jon Kuhrt says: "Pray that the day will be used to reveal God's love and empower us through his spirit to seek justice and compassion." So far over 250 people have booked in to attend.

20 new houses were opened in 2023, including a first house in Belfast. In November, the church welcomed an Afghan family into their house. The family had never seen a toaster or microwave before. The church leader (Tanita) has a cousin who was involved in setting up the sponsorship scheme but is not yet part of the church. By seeing real love and the church's heart, she has changed her thinking about Christians/the church – she has been impressed. Jonathan Wilson, Property and Investment Co-ordinator, says: "The Bible (James 2) says 'Faith without works is dead', so then the opposite is obvious – faith with works of love is very much alive."

Bible Society (Contact: David Anderson)

Over the last few weeks, people have given enough to introduce the power of God's word to thousands of prisoners.

Chaplains are telling us that God is moving powerfully among prisoners as they engage with the Bible. They say: 'Prisoners walk through the valley of death, through the dark night of the soul, and God becomes their guide.'

Emmanuel escaped from a cult in Africa, went to Dubai as a migrant worker, and it was there that he found his calling as a Bible Storyteller. This is his story.

'I am from Ghana in West Africa. My father comes from an animistic faith. I used to observe him doing all the rituals. But for some reason, he respected Christianity and would force me to attend the local church. I found the church boring, so I stopped going. When my father found out I had stopped going to church, he beat me hard.

'In a quest for the truth, I tried another religion which has a strong presence in Ghana. I accepted this faith and practised it faithfully for some time. Then I discovered this cult was bondage and God freed me from it. The turning point was street preaching. I witnessed a conversation between a street preacher from a local church and a passer-by. I was so intrigued by the preacher's answers that, there and then, I decided to attend that church.

'From there, God brought me from West Africa to the Evangelical Church in Dubai where there is a feast of God's word. After the church service, I would get free Bible story training, which your support of Bible Society in the Gulf makes possible.'

Please pray that Leah will be released very soon and returned to her family.

That God will comfort and sustain Leah, and her family.

Please pray for the many other Christians, many of them children, who have been abducted by Boko Haram in Nigeria.

Bangladesh

Life is very hard for Muslim-background believers. Many are attacked, and even young children are beaten. When they report these attacks, very often they find that they themselves end up in prison.

Please pray strength and perseverance for these families, and help for them to forgive their persecutors.

Open Doors are supporting many of these families, where the breadwinners have been jailed, and their dependents left with no means of income to survive.

North Korea

The hardest place in the world to be a Christian.
