The persecuted church: North Korea (Contact: Ken Nash)

North Korea's Songbun system classifies citizens according to their perceived loyalty to the state. The Korean work "songbun" means "ingredients" (substance, makeup), the North Korean's political structure applies the word to identify a citizen's socio-political background. Those with religious beliefs – and especially Christians – are identified as "hostile", and are considered to be enemies of the stat. They are routinely imprisoned, and in many cases executed. Any of the things we take for granted – praying, talking about the faith, owning a Bible, meeting with other believers – would be sufficient to incur the wrath of the regime.

Please continue to pray for Christians facing imprisonment, torture, or execution for their faithfulness in obeying God rather than men (Acts 4:19). Pray that through their courageous witness the Church will continue to grow in North Korea.

International Work

Mission Eurasia

Over the past year, GOOD NEWS for Everyone! has been able to provide funds to purchase Scriptures for Ukraine through Mission Eurasia, a partner organisation of GNFE and ShareWord Global. From 28 July to 5 August, a small team from Mission Eurasia travelled in Moldova and Poland, speaking in churches, encouraging local believers, distributing Scriptures for delivery into Ukraine.

CAP's latest client report, published earlier in the year, highlights the brutal reality of UK poverty and what CAP is doing to tackle it. The statistics and testimonies included are sobering, showing a growing need for CAP's services throughout the UK, but the research also shines a light on the miracles being performed through acts of kindness every day.

Stuart Winter, who works for CAP writes: "Letter after letter has been arriving from people whose lives have been transformed. Honestly, it's incredible to read their stories. So I've asked permission to forward some of the post bag."

- "I had a chippy tea last Friday. It's a small thing, isn't it? But for me, that meal (bought with money I'd saved through budgeting!) felt like a milestone. A new start, thanks to you. Two years ago I was scraping around for coppers to even go to the shops. I was in a violent relationship, my mental health was poor, and I was struggling in every way. But all of you at CAP helped me so much. Everything has changed and I feel like I am walking on a cloud! You gave me a new lease of life. Now I'm not just debt free, I'm a Christian and part of a church family. Believe me, I feel like a different person you wouldn't recognise the Fiona of two years ago. Words can't express how grateful I am. Thank you. In Christ, Fiona"
- "To everyone in the CAP family. You saved my life, and I mean that. I couldn't have become debt free on my own. Your support over the past four years has been AMAZING. You have been so kind, and always professional. You helped me much more than you will ever know. Thank you so much. Terry ¹⁰

• Throughout July and August, at different venues throughout the country, CPAS have been running Ventures and Falcons Christian Residential Holidays for 8–18-year-olds. - CEO Jon Kuhrt was invited to give a lecture about the future of Christian social action for the organisation Together for the Common Good. The event was held in memory of the late MP for Birkenhead, Frank Field, who was a Christian and a life-long anti-poverty campaigner. Jon argues that a practical theology of grace and truth is what we most need to navigate the challenges of Christian social action. This links in with a report on volunteering in the UK, which has declined in recent years. However, HIA is bucking the trend. Volunteers are at the heart of its work. Ukraine

Please pray for family T from MWB's Sarny community. Their son has had a kidney transplant. Pray for a full recovery and that the new kidney functions fully. Iraq

India

Since the BJP lost its majority in recent elections attacks on minority groups, especially Christians, have increased.

The area of Uttar Pradesh has been particularly targeted with many Christians arrested and imprisoned. Their offence? Praying! Many arrested at prayer meetings, betrayed by other villagers. Also accused of forced conversions to Christianity.

Open Doors are supporting many Christian families and providing advocacy for them as they face court appearances for trumped up charges and false accusations.
