PRAYER REQUEST DETAILS

The persecuted church: France (Contact: Ken Nash)

Whilst the last three Olympic opening ceremonies have increasingly used pagan and occult imagery, the Paris event is notorious for having openly mocked Jesus. Attention has been focussed on the blasphemous mocking of Christ and His Apostles at the 'Last Supper'; the depiction of the event as painted by Leonardo da Vinci was preplaced showing the Lord with a fat lesbian who rejoiced in the name 'Barbara Butch'; the simple fare of meat, bread and wine was replaced with a 'meal' of a large near-naked man lounging on the table.

Earlier on, an enormous golden calf was displayed, echoing the pagan Egyptian practice of worship of the cow and calf. There was also a message on the internet: Yes! Yes! It's the Gay New Testament! Many of the mainstream media characterised those who felt deep sorrow at this tarnishing of Christ's sacrifice as 'the intolerant religious right' or 'Christian nationalists'.

The noted extreme left-wing commentator Whoopi Goldberg said "Well, if you're offended, just switch to another channel".

Hope into Action (Contact: Katharine Checketts)

On Wednesday 9th October, over 70 Hope into Action church partners, staff, F&S (Friendship and Support) groups and supporters met online to give thanks for the work and celebrate the achievements of incredible church partners over the last year. This years' service fell the day before World Homeless Day and World Mental Health Day. Mental health is a global crisis, and the focus of the service was on this topic, particularly as it affects HIA tenants directly during their recovery from homelessness.

The guest speaker for the service was Corin Pilling, Director at Sanctuary UK, a charity set up to equip the Church to support mental health and wellbeing. Sanctuary provide resources that meaningfully engage the topics of faith and mental health. Sanctuary UK's content is developed in collaboration with theologians, mental health professionals, and people with lived experience of mental health challenges. These resources prepare communities of faith around the world to raise awareness, reduce stigma, support mental health, and promote mental wellbeing.

Pray that as winter approaches, more people will find refuge and support through partner churches.

Bible Society (Contact: David Anderson)

Egypt focus

The Bible Society has trained young Christians to lead Bible study groups such as the one in Cairo which is flourishing and attracting people of all ages. 10 to 15 million people identify as Christians in this Muslim country of 111 million. Thanks to Bible Society supporters, a further 520 leaders are scheduled to be trained in 2025.

- Praise God that the poorest Christians in Egypt are receiving Bibles for free thanks to the combined efforts of Bible Society supporters, churches, evangelists and the team at Bible Society of Egypt. Pray that this ministry will flourish.
- Pray that Christian families in Egypt will draw nearer to God and have their faith strengthened as they engage with God's word.
- Ask God to bless the 520 people who are scheduled to undergo training in 2025 to lead Bible study groups in Egypt. Pray that God will use these young leaders mightily.

With more than 82 million internet users in Egypt, our colleagues there
are developing a powerful digital ministry. Pray for guidance so the Bible
Society team in Egypt will be able to reach many more people with the
Scriptures through their online apps and social media.

Mission Without Borders (MWB) (Contact: Anne Attfield)

Please continue to pray for children and families living in poverty in Ukraine. Families continue to be separated, and lives torn apart. Many children still spend hours sheltering in the basements of homes. Families are living under great stress and fear.

In Ukraine winters are hard. Heavy snow can block off roads and rural villages, making food scarce. Families face ongoing air raid sirens and the anxiety of trying to provide food for their children. This Christmas, MWB hope to prepare 40,000 Christmas boxes of food, treats and the gospel message to deliver to families in poverty in Ukraine, Moldova, Bulgaria, Romania, Bosnia-Herzegovina and Albania. Called "Operation Christmas Love" it blesses many families.

Sergiy, one of MWB's staff workers in Ukraine says- "The message that we want to convey this Christmas is: 'We see you: we see the suffering you're enduring, and we want to be around to bring you relief." One Mother who received a box last year said, "It was like a miracle. This Christmas, the story of Christ's birth was not simply about a historical event but about a hope that people received. The hope for help and salvation."

Please pray for all those preparing the boxes and delivering them and for the families receiving them. Pray too for the money needed. £30 will buy an emergency Christmas Box for a family in crisis. Please continue to thank God for the partnerships MWB has built with 192 churches in Ukraine enabling them to continue to support tens of thousands of people. Please continue to pray for protection against Russian rocket attacks.

Open Doors (Contact: Judith Anderson)

Open Doors has suggested 7 ways to pray for China, as the country marks 75 years of communist rule.

- 1) The Church. For wisdom, discernment, and courage for church leaders.
- 2) Muslim background believers. For perseverance, strength, and protection for them.
- 3) Buddhist background believers. For perseverance, despite the challenges. For protection of those travelling to reach those in remote and mountainous regions.

4) The Next Generation. Under 18's are forbidden to attend any church activities.

Please pray that parents find effective and relevant ways to build faith in their children. That the restrictions are ineffective in preventing young people from following Jesus.

- 5) Activities arranged by local partners. Please pray for these faithful partners as they seek to nourish others, whilst enduring setbacks, obstacles, and discouragement.
- 6) Church Growth. That the church will continue to see astonishing growth, through the work of the Holy Spirit in peoples' lives.
- 7) China's Leaders. For China's president Xi Jinping, that he would acknowledge the sovereignty of God, and stop his active hostility and opposition to Christianity.

A Prayer encompassing all these requests from Open Doors.

"Heavenly Father, thank you for the courage, resilience, and faith of our Chinese brothers and sisters over the decades. We marvel at all that You have done in, and through Your people. We pray that You will lift those disheartened by pressure and persecution, and ask that You equip, encourage, and empower Your people, amidst different challenges. Provide breakthrough where it's needed today, and meet all their needs. Soften the heart of Xi Jinping, so that he sees Christianity not as a threat, but crucial to the fabric of China. Continue to build Your church in China, we pray. In the powerful name of Jesus. Amen."
