PRAYER REQUEST DETAILS

The persecuted church: UK (Contact: Ken Nash)

Lorcán Price, Legal Counsel for ADF UK, writes:

"In the UK, we're seeing modern-day 'thought crimes' reminiscent of dystopian fiction. Recently the Home Office announced the implementation of nationwide censorship zones (started at the end of October), which will penalise anyone found guilty of 'influencing' someone within 150m of an abortion facility. The ban on 'influencing' is eerily ambiguous, leaving innocent people open to punishment for engaging in consensual conversation or even silent thought."

Take, for example, husband, father and army vet Adam Smith-Connor. Motivated by his personal experience of the trauma and loss surrounding abortion, he now silently prays in public for those affected by such decisions. Despite praying with his back turned to a facility to avoid any impression of intimidation, Bournemouth authorities fined him and subsequently pursued criminal charges.

The case has dragged on for two years and has seen the Council rack up nearly £100,000 legal fees – paid for by the taxpayer. Over a supposed 'crime' with a maximum penalty of £1,000! On October 16th he was found: Guilty. Guilty for living out his faith; guilty for 'slightly bowing' his head in prayer in a public place. He now has to pay £9,000 towards the Council's costs.

"Poverty steals our dignity, limits our opportunities and forces us to believe there is no way out."

Poverty is getting worse by the month in Britain with 3 out of 10 children in the UK living in poverty, according to the Joseph Rowntree Foundation. Now even when the debt counsellors help folk leave debt behind, the spiralling cost of living forces them either back into debt or to do without heating or daily food.

As well as offering debt counselling, money coaching and life skills, CAP now needs to offer emergency food parcels, fuel top up, school uniforms for children whose parents are struggling.

Let's pray that our MP's show increasing understanding of the hardships many of their constituents face and flag up the need to help the financially poorer section of society and put pressure on the Government to reduce energy prices, etc.

Let's pray we have a spirit of empathy with all who for whatever reason have gone into debt, and also show the Lord's generosity to those in need.

"Lord, grant great skills to the CAP and other debt counsellors so that there is lasting change for their customers. Also, may the churches involved with CAP be welcoming and reach out to those in emotional and spiritual as well as financial need. Amen."

"The gospel with a house key"

Last week I was in Nottingham and met three very different people who sum up the difference that Hope into Action makes.

One was a young man, whose life had been terribly affected by drug addiction which drew him into homelessness. After committing to rehab, he moved into a Hope into Action house and is now working and serving as part of a local church, with big dreams for the future: 'I want to do what you are doing and change people's lives.'

Another was a father, who came with his wife and young family to the UK as refugees. They had nowhere to go after their temporary accommodation ended and felt it was a miracle to be offered a Hope into Action home. 'I have no words to describe how grateful I am for what you have done for my family, what you are doing is a true blessing.'

And finally, I met a leader from Trent Vineyard church, who told me about how working with Hope into Action helps them serve the poor in a long-term way: 'We are in it for the long-haul – to see lives changed'.

This is the work that your support enables us to do.

In John Mark Comer's book *Practicing the Way (SPCK, 2024*) he quotes these words about followers of Jesus who show 'radically ordinary hospitality':

"They see God's image reflected in the eyes of every human being on the earth...They open doors; they seek out the under privileged. They know that the gospel comes with a house key."

Bible Society (Contact: David Anderson)

This Christmas, The Bible Society is providing Bibles in places where wars are raging. Our support is offering peace through Jesus to civilians and soldiers on the front lines.

A story from Ukraine

Recently, Deputy General Secretary Anatoliy Raychynets returned from a trip to visit troops on the front line in woods outside Bakhmut. They met soldiers who were manning a cannon, but also reading Psalm 91.

'We were interrupted by shell explosions,' said Anatoliy. 'When I found myself in a trench next to a soldier called Kyrylo, he told me that two weeks ago we had come and given him a Bible.'

Kyrylo told him: 'I have never been to church, never read the Bible, because I never had one. Here, at the combat positions, in short moments of silence, I started reading prayers from the Book of Psalms, as you advised me back then.

'I feel warmth inside me while reading. I have never experienced anything like this in my life. I realised that it was God who came to me, a sinner, at the age of 57. He came here, to the swamp, to the horrors of the war, to find me. Thank you for the Bible. It revived me to a new life, a life with God.' Then Kyrylo asked Anatoliy to pray with him.

'A few minutes later, when everything had quieted down, we continued reading Psalm 91. My voice was a bit hoarse because it was -10 degrees in the forest and I was quite cold,' said Anatoliy.

'God works in an amazing way. His word is alive and active. Thank you that we have Bibles and are able to give them to people in different circumstances.'

Mission Without Borders (MWB) (Contact: Anne Attfield)

As our Church ends its financial support for 'Mission Without Borders' in December when the statutory three-year commitment concludes, I would ask you to continue praying for their staff and volunteers working in the six poorest countries in Eastern Europe.

Ukraine

Please pray for the children trying to continue their education in the midst of war and air raid alarms. Continue to remember families who are suffering, especially one displaced family who lost their daughter in a missile attack. Please pray for the safety of those distributing the 'Operation Christmas Love' boxes in war zones.

Moldova

Please pray for people attending the mission's emotional support meetings, that they will find healing and hope in Jesus. Pray for the Bible Correspondence coordinators in their work of sharing the good news to the communities the mission supports.

Bulgaria

Please pray for the political situation after parliamentary elections. Pray for protection and healing from illness this winter, for the elderly and for families supported by the mission. Many children and adults have been suffering from a respiratory virus.

Romania

Please pray for good leaders after the Presidential and Parliamentary

elections. Pray for the health of the children the mission supports in Romania, as many have been ill and missed a lot of school.

Bosnia- Herzegovina

Please pray for the country's economy. High inflation and constant price changes make life very difficult for poor families. Pray that the good news of hope and love will bless all who come to the mission's Christmas events.

Albania

Please pray for the single parents the mission supports, that they would come to know God's strength, wisdom and provision as they care for their children.

Arise Africa Campaign

Our church sent 98 signatures supporting this campaign last month. The campaign continues until 2026. Please pray that world leaders become increasingly aware of the situation facing Christians in Sub-Saharan Africa.

Sudan and Nigeria are countries greatly affected, as war continues to decimate communities. Open Doors is actively engaged in helping thousands of displaced Christians living in squalid IDP camps.
