PRAYER REQUEST DETAILS

The persecuted church: Syria (Contact: Ken Nash)

Syrian church leaders met with Ahmad al-Sharaa, the head of Syria's transitional government. It was an opportunity for them to raise questions and concerns following the fall of Bashar al-Assad's regime. One main fear was the possibility of Islamist government or renewed civil war. In either scenario, persecution of Christians and other religious minorities would be a real possibility. Sharaa is otherwise known by his Islamist nom de guerre Abu Mohammad al-Jolani, and worked closely with Islamic State (IS, ISIS, ISIL, Daesh). In the days following the fall of Assad, Al Qaeda issued a statement urging the victorious rebels to turn against "Jews and Crusaders" (a pejorative term for Christians).

Unidentified armed groups have attacked a church building and desecrated a Christian cemetery in Hama. In a separate incident, a group of eight men burned a Christmas tree in Suqaylabiyah. Similar incidents have occurred in other parts of the country.

Barnabus Aid

London City Mission (Contact: Elizabeth Bridger)

Much of LCM's work in London is now done in partnership with evangelical Churches across London.

Luke Carson (who spoke in Cromer Parish Church a few years ago) is LCM's Team Leader for Prisons and works alongside King's Cross Church (KXC), training ordinary Church members to reach people in prisons with the Gospel of Christ, informally through chatting and friendship. He is encouraged to see

how this partnership is changing the lives both of the prisoners and these visitors, who give sacrificially of their time to do this work, as they sit alongside and chat with these vulnerable prisoners.

Men in prison often feel forgotten and valueless and are some of the most marginalised and invisible in our society. But the regular prison chapel services and the friendly chats with these Christian prison visitors has enabled many men to open up about their problems and anxieties and seek Christ. Those who become Christians will be much more easily rehabilitated into society after their release as they become part of a Christian community.

Please pray for Luke in this valuable work and that it will be expanded, so bringing more and more men to hear the Gospel and turn to Christ and become witnesses for Him.

In 2024, 713,000 Bibles, New Testaments and Magazines were purchased by Branches, for distribution in the UK. In addition to this, just over £831,000 was given for the purchase of Scriptures around the world. Praise the Lord.

Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC)

Hospitals and aid relief workers are struggling to cope. But still there has been no mention on the UK news of this.

Elizabeth, who works as a migrant worker housemaid in Bahrain, can testify to the power of the Scriptures. I am thankful to this wonderful lady who took me to church, for the pastor who has helped me to love Jesus more and to the Bible Society supporters for giving me a free Bible in my own language. May God bless all of you'.
