## PRAYER REQUEST DETAILS

### **The persecuted church: Communist Asia** (Contact: Ken Nash)

Land, machinery and equipment owned by a Pastor have been confiscated because of his faith. He also believes that the *Vietnamese* authorities poisoned the shrimp farms that are his business.

Several believers in *Laos* were imprisoned for leading a house church service. Each one is a family breadwinner.

An elderly believer from *North Korea*, who roams the woods in China to help escapees, recently fell ill and doctors gave up on him. But he has recovered enough to resume his ministry.

Church leaders in *China* say that church members are growing increasingly concerned about persecution. "Believers are concerned about participating more, being more visible, or interacting more with others".

The regime in *North Korea* categorises citizens according to their perceived loyalty to the State. All followers of religion are classified as "hostile", and worthy of punishment that includes imprisonment, torture, and death in labour camps.

### **London City Mission** (Contact: Elizabeth Bridger)

*The Corner House - Faith Food and Fresh starts*

The Corner House offers 4 men at a time a safe space in which to find their feet after a spell in prison before they re-enter the world outside.

Corner House offers more than bed; it is a small intimate community of men who have fallen on hard times and learn how to live and share together.

They are cared for, served nourishing meals by a team of volunteers who share their table, and they have a mentor, Daniel, to care for their spiritual needs and help them explore their faith at whatever stage they are in their

spiritual journey or none. They share a short morning devotion round the Bible and air their questions.

Like Jim\* straight out of prison where he first found Christ. His eagerness to share his faith with others is very infectious and encouraging.

Corner House offers men like him a unique opportunity to explore the Christian faith in a safe and friendly environment and equip them, when they are ready, to live independently and use their skills and talents to make a valuable contribution to society and witness to Christ's transforming power.

### **Good News for Everyone** (Contact: Jenny Jacquier and Jenny Syder)

Thanks to the generosity of members, Friends, churches, and other supporters, and by God's grace, GNfE has been able to place Bibles internationally.

#### *Pakistan*

There are several countries where in spite of persecution increasing, we are being asked to invest in giving Scriptures to local believers so they can withstand the opposition they face daily. In Pakistan, we work through an in-country partner who is becoming more and more effective in distributing Scriptures. The downside to this efficiency is that our partner has run out of Bibles. Our man in Lahore, has reached out and asked if we can help fulfil the urgent need he has to provide 10,000 Christians with God's Word. GNfE has provided £64,000 to cover the cost of these Urdu Bibles.

#### *Far East*

Our man is still able to travel throughout the country. During summer he was even able to travel where foreigners are not allowed. He was able to meet secretly with a few believers and was able to get them some Bibles. He has had great success in reaching rural churches. He has built an excellent network with pastors of Registered Churches whom he uses as the conduit to get the Bibles that find their way to out-of-the-way rural villages. The way

the ministry works is that a registered church places an order for Bibles from the government printer. We pay for these Bibles and the Bibles are then shipped to the Registered Church. Our man then goes to that church, runs training programmes and is given some of the Bibles which are then distributed to the unregistered churches. This is the only way for the unregistered church to get government-printed Bibles. The government-printed Bibles all contain a stamp confirming their source. If anyone is found with a Bible with no stamp, they are arrested, fined or imprisoned. This is why ministries that smuggle Bibles into the country or don't use the approved system put Christians in danger. ShareWord Global work within the guidelines and has given 12,500 Bibles costing £19,000.

### **CAP – Christians Against Poverty** (Contact: Claire Harber)

CAP has recently become the Christian radio station Premier Praise's charity of the year. Please pray that CAP finds the opportunity through this partnership to connect with new supporters and inspire people to take action against UK poverty.

In May, CAP signed an open letter to the Prime Minister calling for a cross-departmental mental health strategy. The letter expresses concern over the current mental health crisis in the UK. Poor mental health impacts families, society and the economy in a substantial way, contributing to financial hardship when people are unable to work due to the poor mental health of themselves or their loved ones. The letter urges the government to address the causes rather than symptoms of the issue by implementing, 'a cross-departmental mental health strategy, aimed at identifying and addressing the cause of the growing mental health crisis'. This is not solely an action for the health service - solutions need to collaborate with education providers, online safety teams, and welfare departments.

Please pray that the Government take heed of this plea and formulate a plan to tackle the crisis. This might start with prioritising waiting lists for mental health treatment by rolling out neighbourhood mental health centres while research is undertaken to get to the heart of the problem. Pray that the church family recognise the mental health needs of their brothers and sisters, and for the Lord's guidance to help in the right way.

### **Bible Society** (Contact: David Anderson)

It's a criminal offence in Iran to convert from Islam to Christianity. The intended effect is to confine Christianity to the traditional churches of Iran's ethnic minorities, like the Armenians and Assyrians. It isn't working. The country's rapidly growing evangelical churches, illegally holding services in Farsi, are packed, says Nahid.

- Pray for the underground churches in Iran, that the eyes of the authorities will not see them, and that they will continue to flourish.

- Ask God to encourage Nahid and her team through the ups and the downs as they strive to get a million Bibles into Iran in the coming years.
- Pray for Iranians who have fled Iran. As refugees they're extremely vulnerable and could be returned to Iran at any time. Pray that exile is an opportunity for them, both to build a new life and to find God.
